

### Each University will receive your grade and consider:





- o Clearing is how universities fill any places they still have on
- o Clearing opens on UCAS from the 5<sup>th</sup> July 2025
- o Not all Universities or degree programmes will be available
- o Check directly with a University on your eligibility to apply
  - through Clearing
- o Sign up to universities' Clearing service or Clearing alerts

## ACCOMMODATION

✓ When can you apply for accommodation: at conditional or unconditional stage?  $\checkmark$  What type of accommodation is available to you? ✓ Catered, self catered, studio, shared, en-suite Budget vs accommodation costs

What to check: Guarantee policy Guarantee deadline dates What's included in the rent and what will you need to bring Is a deposit or advanced rent payment required?

# **AS** requirement



- Check for any deposit requirement to receive the CAS
- Ensure your personal details are correct on the University application and that they match your passport
- Check how to request your CAS: automated system? Email to Admissions or Visa Team?
- Be aware of peak processing times: likely July – August.

Typically, cannot be requested until you hold an unconditional offer

## TRAVELLING TO THE UK

- Consider purchasing a flexible air fate to allow for changes in case of visa delays
- 15 international airports in the UK with good links by road, rail and air to your destination
- o Low budget airlines for travel within UK and Europe: EasyJet and Ryanair
- Rail fares across the UK: <u>www.trainlines.com</u>
- Check UKVI for information about what documents to bring in your hand luggage
- Arrange your travel from the airport to your accommodation, check if your university provides airport pick-up.

## TRAVELLING TO THE UK AND SETTLING IN

- Organise your packing list  $\bigcirc$
- There are low-cost options for buying essentials in the UK so you can  $\bigcirc$ pack light
- Arrive in time for welcome week
- Schedule your welcome/fresher's week activities  $\bigcirc$
- Check out University support services like health and wellbeing, sports,  $\bigcirc$ student activities, English language and careers
- Collect your BRP  $\bigcirc$
- Open your bank account
- Register with the GP/Doctor  $\bigcirc$

Welcome week checklist

Attend international student orientation and other campus introduction sessions Collect your student ID Collect your timetable and sign-up for courses Join student clubs and societies Get a UK SIM card to stay connected Apply for a National Insurance Number (if you plan to work) □ Familiarise yourself with public transport and seek student passes Learn the local area (supermarket, shops, bus stops)

Identify who to contact in emergencies □ Stay in touch with family



Remember, everyone is in a similar position to you. **Be brave**, **start conversations and make new friends**.
