

- We offer a priority visa service in nearly **190** countries.




High volume visa routes



Who can apply?

You can apply for a UK Student visa if you are 16 or over and:

- Have an offer from an approved education institution.
- Can speak, read, write and understand English.
- Have enough money to pay for your course and support yourself.
- Have consent from your parents if you are under 18.

If you are between 4 and 17 years old and you want to study at an independent school in the UK, you may be eligible for a <u>Child Student</u> <u>visa</u> instead.



Before you apply

- Identify and apply for your course
- Check your education provider is a licensed student sponsor
- Your education provider will send you a reference number called a Confirmation of Acceptance of Study (CAS), once they've offered you a place on a course. You need this before you can apply for a visa.
- Check Gov.uk for the documents you need to prepare for your visa application
- Apply for your visa as soon as you have received your CAS number and have your documents ready

Documents required



You must provide:

- Current passport or travel document
- CAS reference number



Supplying the right documents will help avoid delays to the decision making process



You may also need to provide:

- Proof of finances
- Proof of your knowledge of English
- Birth certificate and parental consent letter if under 18
- Tuberculosis test results (if required)
- ATAS certificate (if required by course)

Knowledge of English

You can prove your knowledge of English by:

- Passing a secure English Language Test (SELT) from an approved provider.
- Having a GCSE, A level, Scottish National Qualification level 4 or 5, Scottish Higher or Advanced Higher in English gained through study at a UK school begun when under 18.
- If you are studying at degree level or above your Higher Education Provider can assess your level of English – and may ask you to do a different test.



Funds

You need enough money to pay for your course and support yourself in the UK.

You may need to provide evidence that you have enough money to cover your living costs – how much depends on where you will be studying:

- London £1,483 for each month of the course (max 9 months)
- Rest of the UK £1,136 for each month of the course (max 9 months)

You can prove you have enough money through:

- Cash in a savings account in student or parent/guardian's name
- Student loan
- Official financial or government sponsorship or grant

Funds must have been held for at least 28 consecutive days prior to submitting your application.

Funds

You may not need to prove you have money to support yourself if:

- you've had a UK visa for 12 months prior to the date of your Student visa application you
 must currently be in the UK
- you're applying as a student union sabbatical officer
- you're applying as a postgraduate doctor or dentist on a recognised foundation programme


Differential evidence requirement

You do not need to prove you have enough money to support yourself if you are a British National (Overseas) ((BN(O)) or from one of the countries or territories listed under the 'differential evidence requirement'. However you do need to have enough funds to make an application.

Visa application process – Improving the Customer Journey with eVisas



Our VACs are run by VFS Global, an external company contracted by UKVI to provide front-end customer services. Once you've chosen and paid for your visa, you'll be automatically redirected to their website where you can book an appointment to provide your biometric information (your fingerprints and photograph).

Customers applying within the UK will usually need to use UKVCAS (UK Visa and Citizenship Services). The UKVCAS service points are managed by our commercial partner TLSContact.

• UKVI starts processing your application once you submit your application (including biometrics) on the <u>UK Immigration: ID Check app</u> or at a <u>VAC</u>.



- Processing times usually take up to **3 weeks**
- You may be able to pay to get a faster decision on your application.
 - within 5 working days ('Priority Visa service')
 - by the end of the next working day ('Super Priority Visa service')
- Applications may take longer to process, some reasons for this may include:
 - the information in your application is not accurate or requires further consideration
 - you need to provide further evidence, for example evidence of funds

UKVI will contact you once a <u>decision has been made on your</u> <u>application</u>.

You do not need to contact UKVI to track your application if you've already made a visa application and it is still within current processing times.

- An eVisa is a person's digital immigration permission for the UK. It's like a digital version of a visa sticker in a person's passport – it shows what a person can and cannot do while in the UK.
- The UKVI account is the digital platform where a person can view their eVisa.
- <u>How do they work together?</u> The eVisa lives inside the UKVI account. You'll always see them together when you log in. They're separate tools but work as one system.
- To use a simple comparison: if the UKVI account is like a digital passport, then the eVisa is like the visa page inside it.

The image on this slide is a sample screen of a person's UKVI account, which shows their eVisa.

Travel to the UK

You can travel to the UK before your course starts:

- Up to 1 week before if course lasts 6 months or less
- Up to 1 month before if course lasts more than 6 months



You must not travel to the UK before the start date given on your visa
